Comments :

a) Several studies, not included in this palm, due to the technical and artistic level will surely be significantly acceptable in other contests!

b) Some studies have very notable anticipations, which will be reported to their authors. In a few cases, considering that the anticipations are partial, I have chosen to include them in the verdict, in particular in the category of honorable mentions and recommendations, special

c) In a few studies, I have observed a lack of solidity (dual or that do not meet the slogan) In these cases I will also inform the authors

d) The sections of the tournament are not properly thematic since they are only distinguished by the number of pieces on the board and by the slogans. In this sense, due to the number of studies to be evaluated, with a very diverse exposition of topics, it has been difficult for me to make comparisons, for the purpose of establishing an order of merits.

This was one of the reasons why I have assigned prizes, mentions and shared recommendations (the presentation of these, in the report, was made taking into account the order in the list of receptions of the studies for the competition)

Special Award for the studies : "The Seasons" (based on sonnets of Antonio Vivaldi)

Introduction

For the anniversary competition JT75 Mario G. Garcia I prepared 11 chess compositions.

Concerning the first four studies it is necessary to give some explanations.

Perhaps one of the most popular pieces of music in the world is a cycle of four concertos by Antonio Vivaldi "Four Seasons", which the composer wrote in 1723 for solo violin and orchestra.

As you know, the music of Vivaldi's The Four Seasons is based on four sonnets written by Antonio Vivaldi himself. This is one of the first examples of program music.

By analogy with program music, we can introduce the concept of a program chess composition.

An analogue of a literary sonnet in a chess composition can be considered a study with a number of moves equal to 14. In addition, the symbolic content of the study should to some extent reflect the semantic associations of a literary work.

The first four studies presented by me in the anniversary competition are an example of a program chess composition. Each study corresponds to a sonnet and a violin concerto written exactly 300 years ago!

A huge number of transcriptions and arrangements of Vivaldi's violin concertos are known, dozens of translations of his four sonnets into different languages of the world have been made.

Interestingly, in 1970 Astor Piazzolla (Argentina) published Estaciones Porteñas, "The Four Seasons of Buenos Aires"; these have been included in "eight seasons" performances, along with Vivaldi's work.

The chess interpretation of Vivaldi's The Four Seasons is presented here, apparently for the first time.

There are 14 figures in the starting position of the study, which emphasizes the shape of the sonnet.

The phoenix theme is held twice, and sounds like a symbol of the spring rebirth of nature, the emergence of new life. The final positional draw is a beautiful "dance of the nymphs" (performed by the white queen, black king and black queen). The white queen describes a closed symmetrical figure, reminiscent of the contours of the wings of a butterfly - a symbol of spring!

The solution of the study contains 14 moves – a sonnet.

Study No2 - Summer

White pieces hold back the advance of Black's passed pawns, events develop in the lower part of the board (on the ground - in the fields and meadows crops ripen, herds graze). Suddenly, the main events move to the top of the board (clouds gather in the sky, a summer thunderstorm begins.) Two white Rooks personify thunder and lightning. A summer thunderstorm with a storm and hail leads to very sad consequences.

The black king is doomed, and a model line checkmate appears on the board!

The solution of the study contains 14 moves – a sonnet.

Study No3 - Autumn

White should be satisfied with his play - he has achieved an overwhelming material advantage in the endgame. (In autumn, people sum up their work - they celebrate with dances and songs the joy of a rich harvest.) But a wild beast (black Rook) constantly creates threats to people and domestic animals. And so the hunt for a dangerous beast (black Rook) begins. Rook tries to save himself by creating more and more threats, but in the end the dangerous beast is caught and neutralized. The holiday continues!

The solution of the study contains 14 moves – a sonnet.

Study No4 - Winter

The symbol of the winter cold is the mirror surface of a frozen pond or lake. Winter time causes inconvenience to people, but at the same time it brings joy: you can go ice skating, play various fun games. In this chess study, the image of the mirror appears three times. In the first try, the promoted white queen is won in two mirror-symmetric variants. In the second try, the white king is checkmated in two mirror-symmetric variants. At the end of the study, a mirror stalemate appears on the board!

The solution of the study contains 14 moves – a sonnet.

JUSTIFICATION FOR THE VERDICT

Art is one of the most challenging concepts to define or categorize within the vast and rigorous territory of *epistēmē*. However, it is one of the most accessible to intuition and feelings. That which originates in the imagination and numen of the creator also finds its way into the same realms of the spirit of the recipient, shaking them with a strange energy that spreads and navigates through mysterious channels. The beauty of forms, movements, sounds, and trajectories sometimes combine and unite, inspiring and infecting one another. A painting by El Greco may find its counterpart in a mystical motet by Tomás Luis de Victoria; can a poem by Victor Hugo possess the colors of Delacroix? Can a poem by Alfred de Musset bring the melodies of a Chopin nocturne to our ears? Or does J. Renoir's *Le Moulin de la Galette* not touch our hearts with a *musette* waltz?

If we are capable of speaking of *romantic chess*, it is because there is an evocative power in the forms, intentions, and whims of those who have constructed it, leading us to that pulsating 19th century. As Alfredo Le Pera once said, we can imagine "*Ghosts of the past, perfumes of yesterday...*"

And that is why we consider commendable and valuable the suite of four studies titled "*The Seasons*" (based on sonnets by Antonio Vivaldi) by **Dr. Eduard Eilazyan**, who, in addition to the merits of his compositional technique, has introduced a clear example of how palpable the artistic dimension that the legendary game condenses, inspires, and expresses. And this purpose of his, beyond all connotations resonating in human subjectivity – and thus within the artistic act itself – is another contribution to what ultimately calls upon us composers: the desire to create **beauty** and transmit it through the mysterious cloth of human sensitivity. Therefore, we have decided to award him a special distinction, which we call: HONORARY AWARD FOR CONTRIBUTION TO THE AESTHETICS OF CHESS.

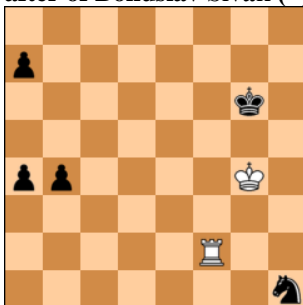
